Dear Assistant Attorney General Clarke:

I remain extremely concerned with the Department of Justice's (DOJ) weaponization of the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act against Americans who stand for life. To date, DOJ has ignored my previous request from October 2022 to disclose FACE Act prosecution data. As Chairman of the Subcommittee on the Constitution and Limited Government of the House Judiciary Committee, I renew these requests as part of our oversight of the DOJ's Civil Rights Division.

The Civil Rights Division continues to use the FACE Act to unfairly target pro-life advocates. On January 30, 2024, six pro-life advocates were found guilty of violating the FACE Act and they now face up to ten and a half years in prison, three years of supervised release, and fines of up to \$260,000.<sup>2</sup> These prosecutions come after DOJ conducted an aggressive raid on the home of pro-life advocate Mark Houck to arrest him on an overzealous FACE Act charge stemming from Mr. Houck's earlier encounter with a belligerent abortion activist who attacked his young son.<sup>3</sup> A Pennsylvania jury rightly acquitted in January 2023.<sup>4</sup>

DOJ's failure to produce FACE Act prosecution data is particularly troubling in light of the apparent disparity between prosecutions targeting pro-life protestors and pro-abortion attacks

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on places of worship and pregnancy resource centers.<sup>5</sup> DOJ's refusal to comply with this request hampers the Committee's constitutional duty to conduct oversight over the Department and the Civil Rights Division. DOJ must return to its core mission of protecting all Americans, not simply those that it favors.

In May 2022, using the Freedom of Information Act, Reveal's Center for Investigative Reporting obtained a list of FACE Act cases filed by DOJ since 1994.<sup>6</sup> In October 2022, I sent a letter to DOJ two years ago requesting a copy of the same information provided to the Center for Investigative Reporting.<sup>7</sup> To date, I have not received a response. I reiterated my request for this data on December 5, 2023, when you appeared before the Subcommittee.<sup>8</sup> In response, you stated, "I can absolutely bring this back to the division's FOIA officials and ensure that you receive a timely response. Please know that the division is committed to even-handed enforcement of the FACE Act." In the two months since your testimony, I have heard nothing from you or your Division.

The Committee must understand how the Department is utilizing the FACE Act to inform any potential legislative reforms. To assist the Committee, please provide the following information:

- 1. Documents sufficient to show how many FACE Act cases have been brought by DOJ since it was enacted in 1994;
- 2. Documents sufficient to show how many FACE Act cases have been filed due to incidents or attacks at abortion providers;
- 3. Documents sufficient to show how many FACE Act cases have been filed due to incidents or attacks at pregnancy resource centers and places of religious worship;
- 4. All documents provided to the Reveal News Center for Investigative Reporting pursuant to its Freedom of Information Act request; and
- 5. Any policies or procedures that DOJ has implemented concerning the filing and prosecution of charges under the FACE Act.

Please provide this information as soon as possible, but not later than 5:00 p.m. on March 1, 2024.
